Amy Szarkowski, PhD, is a psychologist who specializes in working with children who are deaf or hard of hearing and their families. Szarkowski is Director of The Institute at the Children's Center for Communication/Beverly School for the Deaf (CCCBSD), which aims to conduct research, provide professional development, and partner with invested stakeholders to bridge the research-to-practice gap in the areas of Deaf Education and Special Education, focusing on supporting learners with communication challenges. Szarkowski also serves as Core Faculty for LEND (Leadership and Education in Neurodevelopmental and related Disabilities) at Boston Children's Hospital (BCH) and holds an appointment as Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School (HMS). Through BCH/HMS, she is involved with training emerging leaders in the health care professions about working with children with disabilities. Additionally, Szarkowski is an Associate Professor at Gallaudet University, where she teaches in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Infants, Toddlers and their Families (ITF) program. Szarkowski is particularly interested in promoting social-emotional functioning, social communication, and positive well-being in children who are deaf or hard of hearing. She is also proud to be a Joy Ambassador with the Fostering Joy group (#DHHFosteringJoy).
