**Amanda Stead, PhD, CCC-SLP**, is an associate professor in the School of Communication Sciences and Disorders at Pacific University. Her passion for working with dementia patients comes from personal family experience and from her experiences in long-term care settings. It is her personal goal to educate students and the community about the important role speech-language pathologists play in the care of patients with dementia and in end-of-life care. In addition to teaching a course on progressive illness and dementia, Stead teaches graduate



courses in communication and aging, counseling, and aphasia. She was awarded a teaching award from the Oregon Speech-Language & Hearing Association (2013) and the Graduate Teacher of the Year Award at Pacific University (2019). Her current research examines the pedagogy that best prepares future clinicians for work with geriatric patients.
